Environmental Compliance: A concise and frank review of several problematic environmental regulations applicable to healthcare facilities and tools to help ensure compliance.



Green Building: A review of the latest guidance and tools for implementing green building in healthcare remodeling and new construction and a description of challenges and lessons learned from green building practitioners in the healthcare sector.


